## **Key points from Annual General Meeting**

Houses service charge will be £70 for 2024 and 2025

Residents raised issues affected them, with noisy disruption on Garage Road being a key concern. Our local police team will continue to patrol this area, and the Flats Board (who manage Garage Road) are looking into ways things can be improved. We meet regularly with our local Police team.



Dog fouling seems to be increasing, and our local Councillors have arranged for official Council stickers to remind people this is an offence.

### Centenary, pond and gardens projects plans

The pond on Monks Drive has looked wonderful this spring with trees in blossom, even though it's still leaking and the boundary posts and fences need repair. We've been liaising with the Flats Board who are working through some of the tricky issues and costs involved. We've agreed to put some money towards the project and will bring you updates when we have them.

#### GARDENS NEWS- HEDGE ADVICE

The Rose Garden (at the top of Princes Gardens) has had new hedging to replace the areas of dead Privet. The new plants seem to be doing well after a wet winter and spring. We know hedges across the Estate- including in front gardensare vulnerable to honey fungus infection. We recommend both Portuguese Laurel and Griselinia Littoralis as hedging plants that are more resistant.

Many new bulbs have been planted, as well as two new trees – a Cherry in Tudor Gardens and a Liquidambar (Sweet Gum) in the Princes Gardens/Vale Lane triangle garden.

The Estate's trees are a key focus for this year, as they require maintenance to ensure they are healthy and an appropriate size and distance from homes. For example, some self-seeded Ash saplings must be removed as they have dieback disease.

As part of the Estate centenary celebrations residents could consider planting Cherry trees. There were once Cherries (or more properly, Purple Plum) in almost every front garden. The original trees are reaching the end of their lives and each year a few more disappear. To make a start, two new Cherry trees will be planted in the garden on the corner of Queens and Monks Drive – a garden that is looked after by two volunteers. We thank John Stone (our Gardens lead) and the volunteers who help keep the gardens and services roads clean, safe and beautiful.
